

EVANGELOS D. PROTOPAPADAKIS

Evangelos D. Protopapadakis, born in Athens in 1972, is a Full Professor of Applied Ethics at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (NKUA).

Academic Background

- He earned his degree in Philosophy, Pedagogy, and Psychology from the University of Athens in 1997.
- In 2002, he completed his Ph.D. in Philosophy with a dissertation titled “*The Idea of Euthanasia in Contemporary Bioethics.*”

Academic Career

- Since 2004, he has taught at the University of Athens, initially as a lecturer and later as an Associate Professor.
- In 2024, he was appointed Full Professor of Applied Ethics at the same university.

Roles and Responsibilities

- Since 2015, he has served as Director of the Laboratory of Applied Philosophy at NKUA.
- He leads the Greek Unit of the UNESCO Chair in Bioethics (Haifa).
- He is a member of the NKUA Committee on Ethics and Deontology, as well as the Bioethics Committee of the Hellenic Pasteur Institute.

Publications

- Author of four books in Greek and one in English.
- Editor of numerous collective volumes published in various languages.
- He has published over sixty articles in academic journals and conference proceedings at both national and international levels.

Research Interests

- Bioethics, with a particular focus on issues such as euthanasia and human cloning.
- Environmental ethics and the ethical challenges posed by technological advancements.
