She holds a degree in History and Archaeology from the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (EKPA), and pursued further studies in Communication and Media at Panteion University of Athens. She also specialized in Italian Language and Literature at the University for Foreigners of Perugia.

Throughout her career, Bafataki has gained extensive experience in education, media, and journalism, collaborating with both Greek and international outlets. She is particularly known for her commitment to cultural, scientific, and social volunteerism, actively promoting Greek culture in Italy and worldwide.

Since 2012, she has served as **Secretary General of the Giuseppe Sciacca International Awards**, a Vatican-based institution that honors excellence in the fields of culture, scientific and social engagement, and human values.

In May 2024, she was awarded **Lifetime Honorary Membership** by the Mediterranean Lifesaving Confederation (MLC) in recognition of her significant efforts to promote lifesaving sport as an Olympic discipline.
